## RESOLUTION OF THE TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE PYRAMID LAKE PAIUTE TRIBE NIXON, NEVADA

- WHEREAS, the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe, is organized pursuant to the provisions of Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act, (25 U.S.C. 476) and is Federally recognized by the United States Government through the Secretary of the Interior to work with the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs is soliciting for eligible projects to protect Tribal resources from aquatic invasive species by funding the Watercraft Inspection and Decontamination Station to prevent the introduction of aquatic invasive species on the lower Truckee River and Pyramid Lake on Indian Trust lands for the benefit of the threatened and endangered fish species and the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs provides funding support to protect ecosystems, promote safe and quality living environments and strong communities, while protecting the lives, prosperity, and well-being of American Indians. Aquatic invasive species would negatively impact Tribal Trust Resources where such species are not already established; and
- WHEREAS, the prevention of new aquatic invasive species on the Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation through watercraft inspections and decontaminations and public education would allow the tribe to provide better aquatic and terrestrial impact on the Fishery and other Tribal Trust Resources and facilitate long term goals to enhance water quality and spawning habitat; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal being submitted is consistent with planning and development efforts towards other restoration and river resources on the Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation for the betterment of the Tribe and its members.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribal council hereby approves, supports, and authorizes the submittal of the proposal to the Bureau of Indian Affairs, to perform Aquatic Invasive Species Management, Prevention, and Education tasks on the Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Tribal Chairwoman or her designee by hereby authorized to negotiate and sign all grant awards and other future administrative documents necessary for project award and implementation.

## **CERTIFICATION**
