DEFINITION: Under the general direction of the Emergency Response Coordinator and/or his representatives, the EMT-I shall size-up and establish command of an incident, perform a variety of tasks, including the mitigation of emergencies, the prevention of emergencies, and the preparation and training necessary for handling incidents that may occur. The purpose of service is to provide protection to the residents, visitors and businesses of the Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation against the dangers of medical emergencies, and to provide medical response to all members of the community.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Attend training courses, read, and understand assigned material related to emergency medical care.

Perform the necessary tasks associated within the certified level of EMT-Intermediate and including starting I-Vs, intubation, drug administration, taking blood pressures, administering oxygen, performing CPR, medication administration, intermediate airway procedures and all other State approved intermediate skills and shall maintain all required certifications.

Ensure cooperation in working with the volunteer firefighters, assist in annual inventory of firefighting tools and equipment. Assist in fire and emergency medical prevention training and perform all other duties as assigned.

Respond to fire alarms and fire emergencies, The EMT-I, if crossed trained as a firefighter I or Firefighter II, may assist in firefighting activities, such as donning breathing apparatus and making entry into burning buildings with hazardous atmospheres, operating fire pumps, auxiliary equipment, fire hose, ladders, extinguishers, tools and other emergency related equipment.

Perform rescue of potential and known victims at a fire and other emergencies, administer medical aid and perform other duties as assigned by the incident commander.

Respond to vehicle accident scenes and perform extrication techniques using specialized heavy hydraulic equipment.

Perform accurate and complete physical assessments. Safely operate emergency vehicles in accordance with tribal and state statutes.

Attend all training necessary to maintain certifications and other training as required by the Emergency Response Coordinator.

Perform general maintenance work in the up-keep of Fire Rescue property.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES (CONT.):

Follow instructions, adhere to directives, orders, standard operating procedures and policies. Assist with training as assigned.

Perform other related duties as assigned.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Knowledge of: Intermediate Life Support Skills and procedures, including but not limited to: starting I-Vs, intubation, drug administration, Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation, C-Spine precautions, oxygen support and auto-defibrillation; computer use and data entry; firefighting (preferred) and rescue principles, practices and procedures; understanding of the incident command system and hazardous materials response; Tribal rules, regulations, standard operating procedures and policies.

Ability to: utilize emergency medical equipment in a proficient manner, communicate concisely, clearly and effectively in both written and verbal form; perform all interaction with the public and other agencies with a professional attitude of cooperation and an understanding that it is the community that we serve and that they are our customers; analyze firefighting, hazmat and rescue situation and adopt an effective strategy toward mitigation of incident; adhere to policies and procedures in a manner that provides for an effective team effort.

Must submit to extensive background investigation, annual physical exam, drug screen, and required immunizations.

REQUIRED EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE:

Current and valid EMT- Intermediate Certificate (Nevada State Issue or National Registry). Current Hazardous Materials Operations Certificate. Three-years firefighting experience as a volunteer or two years of experience as a full-time firefighter; CPR Instructor certification preferred; Hazardous Materials Technician/Specialist Certification; and EMT Instructor.

Valid Class "B" driver's license with Firefighter endorsement within one month of hire. Must possess a valid Nevada driver's license and be insurable under the Tribe's vehicle insurance policy.

Nevada State Firefighter I or II Certification or Equivalent (preferred but not required).
