No justice, no peace: Anna Marie Scott's family searches for answers nearly two months after her death

Three Years After Body Found, The Murder of Anna Marie Scott Remains Unsolved



In recent months, the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe has been making a renewed push for information into the murder of one of their members, Anna Marie Scott, which took place three years ago.

Scott's body was found in the trunk of a burnt out car on southbound I-580 near the Galena Creek Bridge on Feb. 1, 2022. Officials later said Scott, a 23-year-old mother, had been

The Washoe County Sheriff's Office did not release her identity until four days later, after

Anna Marie Scott was murdered in February 2022. She was shot and stuffed into her car, which was then set on fire on I-580 Southbound at the Galena Creek Bridge.





If you are age 18 by March 31, 2026, and on the approved list of eligible Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribal members per Resolution PL#34-18, then you are eligible to apply for the Minor's Trust. (See Resolution on our website at plpt.nsn.us/enrollment). This is for those enrolled as a Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribal member and living as of April 6, 2018/ December 6, 2024.)

- Minors will have up to six years to complete their forms and claim their economic stimulus payment. The deadline to submit your forms for this 1st Quarter of 2026 is on the last Tuesday of March 2026. Applications received by 03/31/2026 will be processed and forwarded to the Trust the next business day.

- Tribal members under the age of 18 will have their economic stimulus payment placed in a trust account to be managed by the Trust until they reach 18 years of age.
 - Members who will receive their payment from the Minor's Trust can expect distributions within 4 months after the end of the calendar quarter (March, June, September, or December) after they return the completed and signed application.
- Members who have an account in the Minor's Trust will have six years to claim their economic stimulus payment, from the date of their 18th birthday.

 - June 2, 2025: For those who have turned 18 after December 6, 2024, your 2024 Christmas Distribution Funds were placed into the trust, so you will have to follow these guidelines to obtain your funds.

1. Funds will be received at least 4 months after quarter deadline. Please plan accordingly.
2. All Minors' Applications are processed at the same time – turning in a form earlier than the deadline doesn't ensure a faster result.

NOTE: ****You may turn in your form earlier, but it will be held until the appropriate Quarter Deadline your birthday falls under.****

3. The whole process goes from receiving and verifying your information with our PLPT Enrollment office, which includes verifying Enrollment numbers, social security numbers and updated addresses. The paperwork is then submitted to the Trust Company, where it is then processed. The Trust Company then submits their completed forms to the Bank, and after verification with the bank, your money will THEN be distributed – this sometimes takes up to 4 MONTHS. Please plan accordingly, and expect that your money will arrive 4 MONTHS **after** the Quarter Deadline.

4. The Trust company will contact the PLPT office for more information according to their standards – your contact information needs to be legible just in case we need to reach you. If you can't be reached, your form will be held until you contact us.



A reminder to those visiting Pyramid Lake of Drones:

From the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe Regulations Brochure: "1.10.1 DRONES or Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs) are not authorized within the boundaries of the Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation. For government agencies or outside entity requests, a proposal must be made through the Tribe's Inter-Disciplinary Team (IDT) for a recommendation to the Tribal Council."

Pyramid Lake Fire/EMS Department Receives Fire Engine from Bureau of Land Management

In 2025, BLM Nevada transferred five wildland fire engines to rural and volunteer fire departments statewide, helping strengthen local wildfire response ahead of fire season.

Through our Rural Fire Readiness program, BLM provided Type 6 engines at no cost, investing about \$125,000 directly into rural Nevada communities. These engines help local fire departments respond faster to fires. They're often the first on scene in remote parts of Nevada, protecting lives, property, grazing lands, recreation areas, wildlife habitat, and other values critical to rural economies.







Heads up from the PLPT Tax Department:

Prepare Now for Filing 2025 Income Tax Returns

To ensure a smooth 2026 filing season, the IRS recommends taking these steps now:

- **Use Direct Deposit:** **Paper refund checks are being phased out under a new executive order.** If you don't have a bank account, consider opening one to receive refunds electronically. Paper check requests may be frozen up to 90 days.
- **Understand 2025 Tax Law Updates:** Recent legislation introduces new deductions and credits. To claim certain dependent credits, taxpayers and spouses filing jointly must have valid Social Security numbers or ITINs issued by the return due date, including extensions.
- **Review Tax Law Changes:** Familiarize yourself with recent updates and gather necessary documents.
- **Access Your IRS Online Account:** Available 24/7 for viewing account details, making payments, and managing preferences.

Message from the Enrollment Department: TSA Introduces new \$45.00 Fee option for those without a Real ID, starting February 1, 2026.

TSA introduces new \$45 fee option for travelers without REAL ID starting February 1



Agency will refer passengers to the fee-based TSA ConfirmID payment option if they do not present a valid, acceptable ID at checkpoints

WASHINGTON – The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) announced today that it will refer all passengers who do not present an acceptable form of ID and still want to fly an option to pay a \$45 fee to use a modernized alternative identity verification system, TSA ConfirmID, to establish identity at security checkpoints beginning on February 1, 2026.

Travelers will be able to pay \$45 to use TSA ConfirmID for a 10-day travel period. TSA urges travelers who do not have a REAL ID to schedule an appointment at their local DMV to update their ID as soon as possible.

Acceptable forms of ID include:

- **REAL ID**-compliant driver's licenses or other state photo identity cards issued by Department of Motor Vehicles (or equivalent)
 - **If you are not sure if your ID complies with REAL ID, check with your state Department of Motor Vehicles.**
 - A temporary driver's license is not an acceptable form of identification.
- State-issued Enhanced Driver's License (EDL) or Enhanced ID (EID)
- [U.S. passport](#)
- [U.S. passport card](#)
- DHS trusted traveler cards (Global Entry, NEXUS, SENTRI, FAST)
- U.S. Department of Defense ID, including IDs issued to dependents
- Permanent resident card
- Border crossing card
- **An acceptable photo ID issued by a [federally recognized Tribal Nation/Indian Tribe, including Enhanced Tribal Cards \(ETCs\)](#)**
- HSPD-12 PIV card
- Foreign government-issued passport
- Canadian provincial driver's license or Indian and Northern Affairs Canada card
- Transportation Worker Identification Credential (TWIC)
- U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Employment Authorization Card (I-766)
- U.S. Merchant Mariner Credential

- Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC)

All travelers without an acceptable ID, including those who present a non-REAL ID-compliant state driver's license or ID, will be referred to the optional TSA ConfirmID process for identity verification upon TSA check-in and prior to entering the security line. This process will differ airport to airport, and TSA is working with private industry to proactively offer online payment options prior to arrival at the airport.

The REAL ID law was signed more than 20 years ago, but previous presidential administrations failed to properly implement it. Under President Trump's leadership, the law was finally implemented and enforced by Secretary Kristi Noem as of May 7, 2025.

Currently, more than 94% of passengers already use their REAL ID or other acceptable forms of identification. TSA expects increased wait times for passengers who do not provide an acceptable ID.

"Identity verification is essential to traveler safety, because it keeps terrorists, criminals, and illegal aliens out of the skies and other domestic transportation systems such as rail," said Senior Official Performing the Duties of Deputy Administrator for TSA Adam Stahl. "The vast majority of travelers present acceptable identification like REAL IDs and passports, but we must ensure everyone who flies is who they say they are. Beginning February 1, travelers who do not present an acceptable form of ID at our security checkpoints and still want to fly can pay a \$45 fee and undergo the TSA ConfirmID process. This fee ensures the cost to cover verification of an insufficient ID will come from the traveler, not the taxpayer. The security of the traveling public is our top priority, so we urge all travelers to get a REAL ID or other acceptable form of ID as soon as possible to avoid delays and potentially miss flights."

TSA urges all travelers who do not have a REAL ID to pay the fee online before traveling. For passengers who arrive at the airport without paying the fee, information about how to pay for the TSA ConfirmID option will be available at marked locations at or near the checkpoint in most airports. Travelers who undergo TSA ConfirmID processing at an airport should expect delays.
